Since its launch in 1988, the National Flood School has been involved in teaching the theory, science and practice of restoration, in real-life circumstances.

It offers a broad range of specialist courses to train restoration professionals and provides information and support for many other associated industries, including insurers and loss adjusters.

To support its work, the National Flood School has built and uses The Flood House - located at its headquarters in Farnham, Surrey.

Believed to be the only purpose-built floodable house in Europe, the structure - comprised of eight rooms and 60 common household materials - is regularly flooded with 1500 gallons of water.
